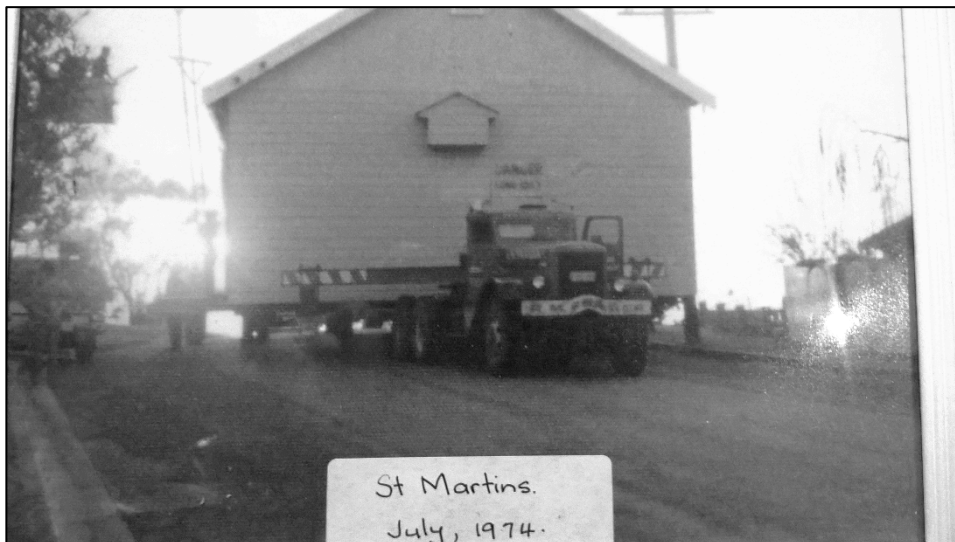
I do not know at this point what the final presentation will be – certainly video version – perhaps a book – who knows. At this point we are collecting and digitising as much history as possible.
